



To win the money for the monthly nominated fish inshore or offshore species, simply weigh in the heaviest **Amberjack** or **Tailor**. All fish weighed, regardless of whether they are in for the 'fish of the month' must be labelled with the angler's name and line class. To receive double club points, fish must be tagged or caught on the Club Weekend only and the cards correctly completed and handed in or fish weighed in at M.B.B.C. from 3.30pm to 4.30pm on the Sunday. Prizes for the heaviest 'fish of the month' will be awarded on the day so you must be there. Remember, club fishing weekend starts on midnight on **Friday 12th July** finishing on **Sunday 14th July** at 3.30-4.30pm.

Update on Ralph's Fishing Lessons at Morayfield

I have been working back at Morayfield State School this year for one day a week. A tough gig but John Eagle has been encouraging me and giving me some counselling...lol. On a more serious note I have been working with about 15 boys in years 5 and 6 who are on the Autistic Spectrum. My responsibility has been to teach them some social skills and anger management strategies.

This term I decided to use fishing as the content of my lessons as this would give them some life skills as well. Some of these boys have never held a rod and very rarely go outside. We tied knots, learnt about different rods, reels and tackle, learnt to identify different species and measure them and finally practised some casting out on the oval.

Our culminating activity was last Saturday at Bribie Island. Unfortunately, the numbers were down a bit due to the weather which wasn't too kind with a 20Knt southerly blowing up the passage and a cold day to boot. We invited families as well, so a few parents and grand parents helped out. We managed to fatten up the local Toad Fish population and only managed to pull one small Bream from the water. However it was a great day. I intend to revisit the topic again later in the year and probably go back to Bribie for our break up day.

I want to thank our club members who donated rods and reels, much appreciated, they will remain at the school for future programs. I approached a couple of the big "Outdoor" retail outlets for donations of tackle and perhaps sponsorship but only got fobbed off by red tape and referrals to head office, bit common these days.

The kids enjoyed the program and so did I.

Fishing initiative not just a passing FAD

South-East Queensland fishers are set to reel in a bigger catch with the installation of fish aggregation devices along the Sunshine and Gold Coasts and in Moreton Bay.

Minister for Agricultural Industry Development and Fisheries Mark Furner said devices, called

FADs, were a floating buoy that gets tethered offshore and attracts fish.

"We're investing \$1 million in rolling out a series of FADs that will attract sports fish species including Mahi Mahi (dolphin fish), cobia and mackerel," Mr Furner said.

"The added benefit of making it more likely that you'll hook one of these species is that it takes some of the pressure off snapper and pearl perch, which are currently overfished and stocks are very low.

"Over the next year we'll be developing a design and installation plan for the FADs in consultation with stakeholders. A FAD monitoring and maintenance program will also be developed."

Member for Lytton Joan Pease said enhancing the fishing experience in Moreton Bay was good for fishers and for local jobs.

"For many people fishing is an important part of Bayside lifestyle, but it also drives more visitors to our region and that creates jobs," Ms Pease said.

"This is a great initiative because it will enhance our reputation as a great place ot drop in a line, and that means more jobs in businesses servicing those visitors.

"We are investing in jobs today and for the future, and delivering infrastructure for our state." Mr Furner said the State Government would also be exploring oppportunties with potential partners who may be interested in matching funding to roll out even more FADs in South East Queensland or more widely.

"NSW Fisheries has already demonstrated success with FADS installed along its it east coast, which attract large numbers of dolphin fish," Mr Furner said.

"We believe that this initiative will help to strengthen world class recreational fishing in Queensland while giving snapper and pearl perch an opportunity to rebuild stocks.

"By encouraging recreational fishers to target species other than snapper and pearl perch, we can ensure that our kids and grandkids will be able to enjoy fishing for these iconic Queensland species in future."
