GFA REPORT





Firstly, out with the old and in with the new, thanks to Brad Clayton for his assistance with QGFA during the last 12 months. Ralph Bowler takes the reigns this year as QGFA delegate, ably assisted by backup QGFA delegate Matt Kroll.

Normally the new delegates walk into the opportunity to travel somewhere illustrious like Cairns or the Gold Coast in September for the QGFA AGM. This years' meeting/event/shindig was planned for somewhere even more special – the Redcliffe Peninsula, but it seems the gods have conspired against us once again and it has been announced it will now be held from the comfort of our own loungerooms from behind a laptop. It should make the drinking and dancing after the AGM a little less embarrassing this year at least. Maybe we can still keep the Weipa lads online and keep the laughs going regardless....

Back to business, we have some voting to do at the next AGM, two special resolutions and one notice of motion. In summary:

Resolution 1 with regards to electing QGFA Committee members:

Amend the constitution so that a nominee for election to the Executive Committee must have either;

Held the position of Delegate to the QGFA on behalf of a Member Club, or

previously held or currently hold a position on the Executive of a Member Club for a period of 12 month or more.

The reasoning behind Resolution 1 is with a view to ensure that the executive committee carries an appropriate amount of experience to add value to the committee.

Resolution 2 with regards to Proxy voting:

(a) If a Member Club is unable to appoint a delegate or substitute delegate from their club under Clause 4.01(d) and (e) to attend a (annual) general meeting of the Association and wishes to exercise their vote/s they may appoint a proxy.

- (b) If a Member Club wants a proxy to vote as instructed "for or against" or "as the proxy considers appropriate" on elections, motions and or special resolutions, the instrument appointing the proxy must be on the form provided by the Association prior to the meeting for that purpose and must be in the hands of the Secretary on or before the date required by the Secretary.
- (c) Proxy forms that are received after the date required by the Secretary will not be accepted unless the Member Club has registered a delegate/s and can provide the Association with a bona fide reason why their registered delegate/substitute delegate is unable to attend.
- (d) The person being appointed to carry a proxy must be a current financial member/Life Member of a Member Club or a QGFA Life Member or current Executive Committee Member.
- (e) A Member Club may appoint only one proxy who will carry the entire club voting entitlement/s.
- (f) Member Club Delegates are not eligible to carry a proxy on behalf of another Member Club.

Apart from a lot of confusing legal speak, essentially this wording avoids confusion on proxy votes being submitted following an AGM as opposed to at an AGM.

And finally, a Notice of Motion relating to a new zone and associated line class

Introduce a new zone for line classes of 15kg-24kg for fishing water depths of 80 metres and deeper for Allports competition and all other QGFA end of year trophies. i.e. all fishing.

The rationale for this one is quite lengthy, but some good points have been made, so bear with us and take the time to

This past season has witnessed larger classes of fish on inshore waters 80 to 100 metres which has seen extended and prolonged fish fighting times on 8kg lines. As a sport that prides itself and is founded on the principals of fish health on release it is unreasonable to expect that a fish will be in its absolute best condition for release after being tagged after having endured an extended fight due to using a lighter line class.

Fraser Island Waters regularly see heavy tackle fish in depths of 80-100 metres also, again the amendment to this rule will see reduced fight times ensuring better health of fish on release.

Sunshine Coast has this last two seasons witnessed smaller blue marlin and striped marlin on "light tackle" grounds at 100-120 metres which has resulted in extended fight periods.


The inclusion of waters from 80 metres for 15-24kg line classes allows an opportunity for all clubs and to fish their shallower bait grounds and "evens up" the opportunity to be successful in their years input to end of year point score trophies etc.as well as ensuring the health of our target species on release.

Furthermore, the water depth was changed a few years back proposed then by Gold Coast due to what was a perceived inequity with respect to the All ports trophies however the rule was amended to be inclusive for all trophies, this change to the rules seeks to be more inclusive of all club fishing grounds for all fishing in zones 3 and 4.

Ralph will be carrying the votes for our club as directed by the executive committee to the AGM on the 26th of September, so these will be discussed briefly at the next meeting for input by all.

Anyhoo, that's it for this episode given the paper we are chewing up in the tackle box with the first report. Hopefully the space will be taken up with something a little easier to read next month. Ralph and Matt.


