We didn't catch the numbers and quality that some other ANSA members did but I still enjoyed the challenge. This year the festival is at Yeppoon so I am definitely going to fish the Fitzroy River which will be another new destination for me. Another highlight of the year was watching Vaughn Daly get his first Barramundi while casting paddle-tail plastics at Lenthalls Dam. It was a very exciting moment for the young man who has only been fishing a few years and ticks off another species. As soon as the weather heats up we will be back to Lenthalls.

We had many enjoyable events throughout the year, include our Sportfish competition, the Somerset Interclub, Borumba Tag-a-tog and several social weekends with other ANSA members. And I can't wait to do it all again this year.

Currently my boat "Kingfisher" is out of action so it will be a slow start to the fishing year for me. Give you all a head start. On the fishing front, my last few trips out have provide me good numbers of mid-size Flathead. Most of my success has been on the last half of the run out tide casting soft plastics like Gulp 4' swimming mullets or Squidgy Wrigglers rigged on a suitable jig head. I like cast to the edge and hop them back to the boat but if the water is shallow enough you can slow roll them back and pause as it rolls over any drop-offs.

Good luck to everyone for the new fishing year and I hope you tick a few of your bucket list.



FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE | Tuesday, 18th May 2021 GET READY TO FISH FOR YOUR MENTAL HEALTH AUSTRALIA!



The date for this year's highly anticipated Gone Fishing Day is Sunday 10th October 2021, coinciding with international mental health day.

The Australian Recreational Fishing Foundation's Executive Officer Adam Martin announced today and saying expectations could not be higher following the event's stunning online success last year.

In 2020, the national event reached 450,000 people on social media and over 1000 locations around Australia participated.

"Gone Fishing Day may be our nation's biggest event on the fishing calendar and a celebration of our sport on a massive scale, but it also gives us an opportunity to showcase the many benefits recreational fishing brings.

That is why this year we will shine a light on how recreational fishing can improve mental health; a message that is relevant to all Australians, not just those who fish, and we look forward to making further announcements as we get closer to the date." he said.

Recreational fishing emerged as one of the most participated activities during the Covid-19 pandemic when social, outdoor, and sporting activities were restricted, resulting in more Australians picking up a fishing rod for the first time.

Mr Martin said there has never been a better time to promote fishing to improve a person's mental health and wellbeing by connecting with the natural environment.

"It is widely understood that fishing can improve a person's mindset and self-esteem, but it also helps you focus on the simple nature of wetting a line."

Australians are being encouraged to participate on Sunday 10th October and to download the Gone Fishing Day App where participants can upload photos of their catch and location.

Fishing is central to the Australian way of life with an estimated 3.5 million participants annually wetting a line from the shore or boat or donning a wetsuit in pursuit of diverse fishing experiences. For some it is a sport or a leisure activity, for others it is a social activity spent with family and friends. Whether you are young or old, recreational fishing is a lifelong activity that everyone can enjoy while connecting with Australia's unique marine and aquatic environments.
