Noel weighed two pearlies (1.16kg and 1.72kg) and two Snapper with the heaviest being 2.85kg, Making Noel the winner of Septembers offshore fish of the month.

Only two whiting were weighed in with Jon and Diego competing for the inshore species. Jon's Whiting went 0.07 kg and Diego's went 0.12kg, making Diego the winner of this month's inshore species.

Thank you to Greg for looking after the BBQ and cooking. Congratulations to Noel and Diego on the fish of the month and to everyone who weighed a fish. Hope to see you all next month with lots of fish to weigh.

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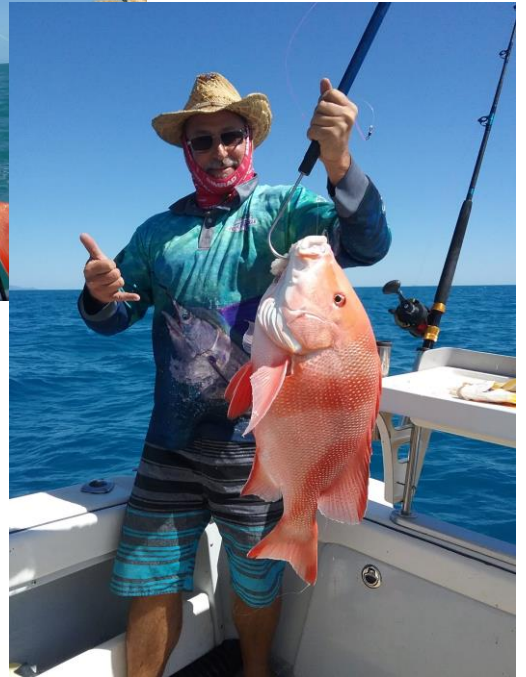

To receive double club points, fish must be tagged or caught on the Club Weekend only and the cards correctly completed and handed in or fish weighed in at M.B.B.C. from 3.30pm to 4.30pm on the Sunday. Prizes for the heaviest 'fish of the month' will be awarded on the day so you must be there. Remember, club fishing weekend starts on midnight on **Friday 18th October** finishing on **Sunday 20th October** at 3.30-4.30pm.

Recipe of the Month



Thai Green Curry

– by Darren (Bones) Essex

INGREDIENTS

- Long Grain Jasmine Rice – cooked as per directions
- 2 tablespoons vegetable or peanut Oil
- 1 brown onion, cut into thin wedges
- 1/2 x 210g jar Thai Green Curry Paste (I like Valcom Brand) – use the whole jar if you like it hot!
- 400ml coconut milk
- 60ml (1/4 cup) Fish Stock, or Chicken Stock, or Water – add more if required
- White Fish 3cm cubes – as much as you want but 500g is a good start (barra, snapper, threadfin, trout, etc)
- 1 green or red capsicum, seeded, thinly sliced
- 200g green beans – topped and halved diagonally
- 1/2 bunch coriander, leaves picked
- 1 tablespoon fish sauce
- 1 tablespoon brown sugar
- 1 cup (65g) bean sprouts (optional)
- 1/3 cup fresh (Thai) Basil
- 2 limes, cut into wedges
- sliced red chilli or chilli flakes to taste (optional)

METHOD

- Step 1 : Cook the rice following the packet directions.
- Step 2 : Meanwhile, heat the oil in a large frying pan over medium-high heat. Add the onion and cook, stirring, for 2 mins or until onion softens. Add the curry paste. Cook, stirring, for 2-4 mins or until fragrant.
- Step 3 : Add the coconut milk and stock/water. Bring to a simmer. Add the capsicum and green beans and cook for 2-3 mins or until almost cooked through. Chop half the basil and coriander leaves and add to the curry. Stir in the fish sauce, sugar and half the bean sprouts, along with the fish and cook until tender but not falling apart. Squeeze over half the lime wedges.
- Step 4 : Taste and add more fish sauce, sugar, chilli and lime juice, if desired.
- Step 5 : Top the curry with remaining bean sprouts, and coriander leaves.
- Step 6 : Serve with the rice and lime wedges and Enjoy
