RECORDER REPORT - August

Hi members,

Our club has developed and change over the years. Some years the anglers can be very competitive and other years it is mostly social fishing club. Either way there is something for ever member depending on what you hope to achieve.

Personally, I like to be somewhat competitive. I feel by being competitive, I fish better and catch more fish. I like to apply myself more and work harder and enjoy the outcome. I love social fishing too and not always worried about points. What I do like is targeting a particular species of fish and work them out.

Our club is a very social club but if you want to be competitive and get some points that go towards trophies at the end of the year, then you need to fish within some specific rules. These rules are meant to be a handicap to even out the playing field. That is why we have Sportfish and Gamefish fishing rules and point scores.

Remember, if you are not fishing within the gamefishing rules than you are not a game fishman, you are just a fisherman. Same for Sportfishing. Think about that.

If you need to know how club competition points are determined for your submitted captures throughout the year, then visit the fishing rules are on the RPGSC website. Here you will find the weight points formulas and tag point tables.

Currently, there has not many fish submitted, but juniors Jesse Harbourne and Lleyton Kruger have started well. Great to see young fellas.

Please remember that members can weigh their fish themselves outside of club weekends. You will need to have your scales checked out by the weighmaster for accuracy. You can get this done at the club weigh-in each month. Complete a capture sheet and send it to the recorder along with pictures. If the fish is a record, you will need to weigh it on official registered scales.

We now have a Capture sheet to the website. This would be useful for members don't have access to an official capture book available. You will find it a www.rpgfc.com.au under the Club points tab. Take the time to learn and understand the rules before you hit the water.

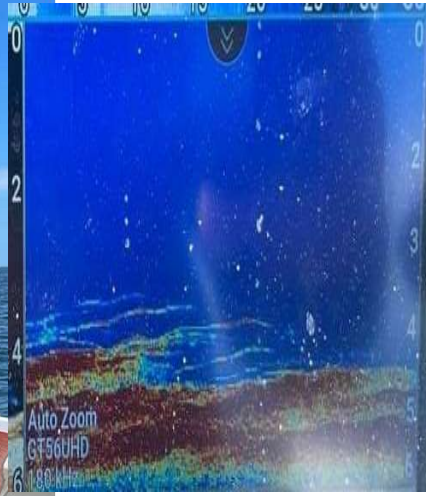

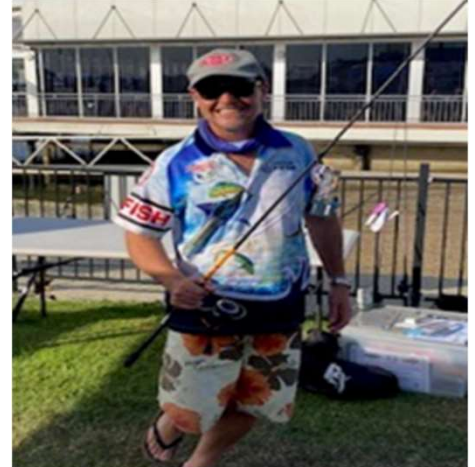
